At the UIA 2008 Torino Congress, the South African Institute of Architects (SAIA) won the bid to host this triennial World Congress with the support of the national Department of Public Works, barely nine years after SAIA's post-Democracy readmission to the UIA.

CONVERSATIONS ON PRACTICE

Submission guidelines and format

- Submission of a 350-word statement on one or a number of the topics listed
- Selected statements will form part of a series of conversations and debates where architects will share experiences on the various challenges that they face in practice in SA
- Selected submissions will be categorized into teams
- Each team will then join in a conversation which will be convened by a well-known practicing SA architect.
- A series of these sessions will be organized as a parallel activity during the 3 main days of the Congress

Eligibility and process

- The call is restricted to South African architectural practices.
- The contact person must be registered with SACAP in one of the registration categories.

- All accepted presenters must be registered as Congress Delegates to be able to access the event venue.

Submission review and selection

Submissions will be reviewed by the UIA 2014 Project Review Panel and are expected to meet these minimum criteria:

- Adherence to proposal submission instructions
- Potential for engaging participants in substantive discussions.
- Originality.
- Engaging and inspiring contribution to the UIA 2014 Congress.
- The language of submission is strictly ENGLISH.
